



## CURRICULUM OF SCIENTIFIC AND TEACHING ACTIVITY

Prof. Angela Santangelo, born in Milan on 15-1-1969, graduated from the University of Milan in History of Italian Law in academic year 1991-1992 with full marks and honors. She is a PhD in History of Medieval and Modern Law (University of Milan) and in *Droit canonique* (Université Paris XI). In the academic year 1997-1998 won a scholarship granted by the CNR for young graduates and in 1998 a scholarship for conducting post-PhD activities at the University of Milan. She was a university researcher from 1999 to 2002.

Professor of the second band since 2002, she is the owner of the teachings of History of Medieval and Modern Law and of *Ius commune*. From 2006 to 2010 she was entrusted with the teaching of History of Medieval and Modern Law at the Faculty of Law of the University of Bergamo.

She has mainly dealt with legal doctrine and procedural practice in the age of *ius commune*, with particular reference to the jurisprudence of the Roman Rota and anti-heretical trials in the Roman Inquisition (monographs), as well as profiles relating to family law and succession law. from the late Middle Ages to the modern age. She has published essays relating to legal culture and the role of the jurist between the age of the reforms and that of modern codifications, with special reference to the Lombard area, two monographs dedicated to the role of legal doctrine in unitary criminal codification and various contributions on criminal profiles and criminal trial in the centuries of the Ancient Regime.

She has held doctoral lessons (University of Milan) and has participated in national and international conferences and congresses, with particular regard to the International Congress of Medieval Canon Law, the *Journées Internationales de la Société d'Histoire du droit* (France and Spain), at the conferences organized by the Centre for studies of the civilisation of the late Middle Ages in San Miniato, the Association « Ottava Medievale » in Orte, the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross, Villa Vigoni. She has lectured at the International Research Center for Local Histories and Cultural Diversities at the University of Insubria.

In the a.a. 2002-2003 and 2004-2005 was the holder of the course of Fundamentals of European law at the School of specialization for the legal professions of Milan.

From 2007 to 2013 she was *Directeur étranger de thèse* in co-tutorship with the *Université de Lyon III* (Jean Moulin) and from 2013 PhD thesis tutors at the University she belonged to.

He is a member of the Italian Society of the History of Law, of the *Société d'histoire of Droit*, of the Lombard Historical Society and of the ICMAC (Iuris Canonici Medii Aevi Consociatio).

She has coordinated as scientific manager numerous research projects funded by the University he belongs to and, as Head of the Milan Unit, two PRIN projects (2006 and 2008).

From 2009 to 2012 she was a member of the Area Committee of the University Commission for Scientific Research (CARST), in the three-year period 2012-2015 effective member of the College of Discipline of the University (second section) and for the three year period 2015-2018 nominated President of the same.

In the 2012 session he unanimously obtained the National Scientific Qualification as a first class professor.

For the three-year period 2016-2019, she was appointed Scientific Director of the Legal Studies Section of the Library of Legal and Humanistic Studies of the University of Milan. From January 2017 he is a member of the “Giunta” of the Department of Private Law and History of Law (University of Milan).
