I have two academic positions (both part-time, as allowed by Legge Gelmini of 2010) as Ricercatore Confermato at Milan State University (Department of Social and Political Sciences) and as Professor Agregado at the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya (UOC) in the Department of Communication Studies (Grade III, equivalent to Associate Professor in the Italian University System); At UOC I also direct the international research group Open Evidence carrying out 'Translational Social and Behavioural Sciences Research'. With Professor George Gaskell of London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) I co-founded and co-directed the Research Consortium 'LSE & Partners' for the design and realisation of behavioural studies. Between July 2014 and December 2015, I was Visiting Senior Research Fellow at the Media and Communication Department of London School of Economics. In the course of my academic career I have also taken three leaves of absence to serve as civil servant at the United Nations (2003-2004) and at the European Union (2009-2011 and 2015-2016).

I have an interdisciplinary educational background and research experience as I started with economics (Laurea in Economia Politica at Bocconi University), then moved to sociology (PhD at NYU), and since 2012 I developed new expertise and practice (I designed and conducted between 2012 and 2019 many behavioural experiments) in behavioural economics and more broadly in the behavioural sciences. My research trajectory started with the study of economic and political transitions in the post-Soviet space, then focussed on the study of immigration and citizenship in Europe; since 2005 I have moved to applied policy research applying a sociological institutionalist approach to the analysis of adoption of technology by organisations, individuals, and social groups. Since 2012 I have started to work in the behavioural testing of policy options mostly in the domain of consumer and public health policies. Throughout the different research streams carried out I have maintained a perspective at the crossroads between sociology and economics, focussing on the institutional and social embeddedness of economic action. Since 2012 as a natural evolution of this perspective I have started to look at the cognitive and emotional bases of economic and social action and I have developed a new theoretical, methodological, and applied experience in behavioural economics and in the behavioural foundations of policy making. I master equally well both qualitative (in-depth interviews, case study research design, qualitative comparative analysis) and quantitative (experimental and observational design, survey design, multivariate statistics and econometrics) research methods and techniques. I am working at the interdisciplinary frontier of the social sciences

(economics, sociology, psychology, and political science) and elaborating new theoretical and methodological approaches at the agency/structure juncture. I have a strong track record of publications in International peer-reviewed top journals, which is visible in my key impact metrics (Query performed 05-01-2020, Source: Publish or Perish, based on google scholar). By number of citations and h-index in the last 5 year I would meet the threshold values of most of the bibliometric sectors as defined in the 'D.M. 8 agosto 2018, n. 589 – tabelle valori-soglia candidati e commissari' (<https://www.miur.gov.it/documents/20182/6393470/Allegati+al+DM+589-2018+-+Tabelle+Valori+Soglia.pdf/d2f0d727-90bd-4473-9093-c0c911cb1014?version=1.0>). Main research streams

2015-2020	<i>The platform economy: rhetorics, disputes, and policy making under condition of uncertainties.</i> I conducted a wide ranging and inter-disciplinary analysis of the platform economy in general and of the so-called ‘sharing economy’. This included also the analysis of the future of work and of the sociological and behavioural characterisation of non-standard work forms. I have looked at the existing evidence on the alleged effects of the online platforms, but also deconstructed and unpacked current rhetorics pointing out vested interest and stakeholders’ positioning. As a result, I have identified a set of options for regulatory and policy interventions, as well as a research agenda to fill existing gaps in the available empirical evidence.
2012-2015	<i>Behavioural experiments on the cognitive consequences of inequalities</i> . I have co-funded through UOC, together with other universities (Columbia University, and Conrad Lorenz University) and co-designed two research projects: a) “Inequalities, aspirations, and efforts: an experimental analysis”. Within the context of behavioural economics, it is being shown that the poor or the less equal are neither less nor more rational than other individuals. Simply they face situations with stronger external constraints and internal cognitive pressures that can hamper their cognitive abilities and their aspirations. This research aimed, through an experimental design to be conducted with a sample of 200 students and unemployed in Bogotá, to test the extent to which the allocation of unequal conditions for the realisation of the experimental tasks (presented as a work assignment for which the participant will sign a short term labour contracts) impact on aspirations and on efforts (productivity); b) “The cognitive and social effects of the programme for land restitution to displaced person in Colombia”. Displaced persons will be interviewed and asked to perform experimental

tasks before and after the restitution of land to test for the cognitive and social effects of suffered violence and resources scarcity.

- 2012-present **Behavioural foundations of policy and beyond.** I have established together with Professor George Gaskell (LSE) the Research Consortium 'LSE & Partners' involving the London School of Economics and Political Science, the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya, The Behavioural Insight Team, Leicester University and two market research companies. The research has a multidisciplinary team comprising behavioural economists, cognitive and social psychologists, sociologists, econometricians, and statisticians. Ever since 2012 this research consortium has conducted (and is conducting dozens of behavioural experimental studies for the European Commission. In collaboration with other members of the research consortium I have designed and directed a dozen laboratory experiments and 10 online experiments, all designed as randomised control trials. This move into behavioural economics and the behavioural approach to policy represents a natural evolution in my trajectory of research at the crossroads between sociology and economics as applied to policy analysis. I am currently work at the micro/macro or agency/structure juncture by integrating the sociological perspective with new insights from the behavioural economics and the neurosciences. The objective is to bridge between the cognitive universalism of most behavioural approach and cognitive sociology where cognition is seen as shaped by social position.
- 2005-present **Socio-economic and institutional analysis of Information Society policies.** In 2005 I have started to work in applied policy research mostly for the European Commission through grants (FP6 and FP7, Horizon2020) and scientific studies (awarded through competitive Tenders). This research stream has had several vertical sub-components (eGovernment, digital inclusion, eHealth) but two common horizontal dimensions: 1) sociological and institutional analysis of adoption (or non-adoption) of technological innovation among institutions (public agencies, healthcare organisations), professionals (i.e. doctors and nurses), and users (all population, marginal groups, the elderly); 2) impact evaluation of public policies and investments in these areas. As per the first dimension I continued to apply my sociological perspective (neo-institutionalism and eGovernment, social stratification and digital inclusion, ICT and immigrant integration, ageing process and assistive technologies, social capital and ICT, social and economic analysis of innovation) and methodological skills (case study design, in-depth interview, cognitive aspect of survey methodology, multivariate statistical analysis of survey data). On the other hand, on the second dimension I gradually built a new area of expertise where I reactivated my econometrics skills in that I used counterfactual methods for ex post evaluations and ex ante modelling simulations.
- 2002-2003 **Immigrant entrepreneurs in Milan and its province.** In collaboration with A. Chiesi, E. Zucchetti, and L. Solari we conducted a research project on immigrant entrepreneurs in Milan and its province funded by Bocconi University and Milan Chamber of Commerce. The research comprised both a quantitative analysis of Chamber of Commerce registry data and in-depth interviews with immigrant entrepreneurs (using non-probabilistic theory-based sampling).
- 1996-2000 **Ethnic relations, immigration and citizenship, migration policies.** As post-doctoral research fellow at Utrecht University I have started a new stream of research focussed on the topic of ethnic relations, immigration and citizenship in Europe, and on migration policies. I have continued this line of research with funding from Fondazione Cariplo ISMU, and then raising funds and managing for three years the Ethnobarometer Project (monitoring ethnic relations in Europe). This line of research has been based mostly on secondary sources analysis and the application of Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA).
- 1994-1996 **National question and ethnic conflicts in the post-Soviet Space.** I directed a two-years research project (funded by the Fondazione Cariplo ISMU) on the emergence of new states with their ensuing ethnic conflicts and forced migrations. The approach to the national question and to ethnic conflict was also neo-institutionalist. The research entailed repeated fieldwork to gather statistics and secondary sources, and to conduct in-depth interviews. I have applied the Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA) to explain different degrees of separatism and secessionism across the Post-Soviet space.
- 1992-1993 **Emerging market institutions and economic elites in Russia.** For my PhD dissertation, while research fellows at the Russian Academy of Science and with funding from New York University, I have applied a neo-institutionalist approach to study the emergence of new economic institutions and actors in post-Soviet Russia. The fieldwork comprised both design and realisation of a survey (N=1000) of new firms in Moscow and S. Petersburg and long biographic interviews with the 100 most influential members of the emerging economic elites in Moscow.

The research is expected to produce new robust evidence on, and contribute to the to the theoretical understanding of, factors determining or influencing the quality (and potential public interest orientation) of health services in Europe. To this purpose a Randomised Control Trial (RCT) is being implemented with 2000 social entrepreneurs in Europe involving a control group and two treatment groups, the first provided with opportunity of face2face networking and the second of virtual networking through an online platform. All social entrepreneurs will present a business proposal to be evaluated by venture capitalists. The research is expected to assess how face2face or virtual networking affect the quality of the business proposals. This research, through an online survey and experiment in 10 European countries, provided evidence on the social and economic conditions of individual employed under non-standard work form, analysed their attitudes toward social protection, and through a contrastive vignette experiment tested the hypothesis that especially young people with precarious job show myopia and hyperbolic discounting when deciding about forms of social protection and their future pensions. The research showed that individual in precarious work have little access to social protection and it is scarcity rather than myopia or hyperbolic discounting that explain why they do not enrol in voluntary social protection or pension schemes.
