PROF. FRANCESCO GOISIS, PhD



Professor Francesco Goisis was born in 1975 in Lodi, where he attended *Liceo classico statale "Pietro Verri"* and obtained his secondary-school diploma with the maximum score.

He was an undergraduate and postgraduate at the University of Milan (*Università degli studi di Milano*) where in 1998 he graduated *summa cum laude* in Law defending a thesis on local authorities owned companies (for which he received the *SOGEMI* prize for the best thesis on management of local public utilities in Italy) and in 2002 obtained a PhD in Administrative Law, defending a thesis on the legal regime of public authorities owned companies.

After a short period as a post-doctoral fellow with grant, in 2002 Professor Goisis was appointed as tenured researcher in Administrative Laws at the Law Faculty of the University of Milan and temporary professor in Administrative Law at the postgraduate School for Bar Professions of the same University and in 2008, further to a 2005 public selection announced by the University of Milano Bicocca in which in 2006 he was unanimously proposed for the promotion to associate professor, he was appointed as tenured associate professor in Administrative Law at the Law Faculty of the University of Milan.

In 2012, further to a 2008 public selection of the University *Jean Monnet* of Bari, in which in 2010 he was unanimously proposed for the promotion to full professor, he was appointed as full professor with tenure in Administrative Law at the Law Faculty of the University of Milan, where he currently lectures Administrative Law Justice, Environmental Law and Public Contracts Law and he is a member of the Board of Professors of the PhD school in Public Law.

He has undertaken research visits to various countries and, in particular, he has been visiting scholar at the Universities of Cardiff (2000) and Nottingham - Public Procurement Research Group (2010).

He has over 70 publications in Italian as well as in English in journals and collective books and is the author of three books: in 2004, on the legal regime and nature of public authorities companies, in 2007, on the sport justice and its relationship with the state justice and in particular the administrative courts and in 2014-2015-2018, on the protection of the citizens against administrative sanctions, in the light of domestic and ECHR laws (a complete and updated list of publications is available at <https://air.unimi.it/simple-search?query=goisis+francesco#.VToWGnIcTIU>).

He has spoken in various national and international scientific symposia (for example, at the 2013 annual symposium of the Italian Association of Full Professors in Administrative Law, *Le Amministrazioni pubbliche in forma privatistica*, and at those organized by the New York University (*The New Public Law in a Global (Dis)Order A Perspective from Italy*, 2010), by the Oxford University (*Oxford Fermo Summer Symposium - At the Boundaries of Law and Society*, 2014) and by the Association of Councils of State and Supreme Administrative Jurisdictions of the European Union, *ACA (Administrative Sanctions in European law*, 2017).

His research interests include nature and legal regime of public enterprises, legal principles according to which identifying a public law

entity, sport law, admissibility of settlement agreements and arbitration clauses in Administrative Law disputes, public contracts and public concessions, public utilities, influence of European Convention of Human Right and of European Union Law in the field of Administrative Law, administrative sanctions, interim measures remedies in administrative courts justice, Environmental Law, with specific regard to environmental liability, polluter pays principle and judicial standing of non-governmental environmental associations.

He is member to the editorial board of the scientific review *Diritto processuale amministrativo* (top ranked according to ANVUR, the Italian Agency for the Evaluation of the University System), of the International review *Social Sciences(SS)* and of the editors board of the *Rivista italiana di diritto sportivo*.

He is a member of the Italian Association of Full Professors in Administrative Law, the Italian Society of Administrative Procedure Law, of the European Law Institute (Vienna) and of PLAN Network - Procurement Law Academic Network.

A member of the Milan Bar Association, he was admitted to represent clients before Ordinary Courts and Supreme Courts in 2001 and 2008, respectively. In 2016, he was appointed as a member of the Arbitration Chamber for Public Contracts at ANAC (National Anticorruption Authority) and has an extensive experience as chairman of ADR boards in the field of public works (*accordi bonari*).
