TRAINING OR RESEARCH ACTIVITY

After getting a Master’s Degree in Human and Social Sciences (specialization in History), I began my PhD in 2015 (title of the dissertation: “Normandy in the Atlantic Economic during the 18th century. *Trade, Crises and production*). My thesis analyzes the consequences of various trade shocks on population and how they respond to those episodes of distress and crisis. To do so, I built several datasets on food riots (proxy use to measure the intensity of a crisis), *cahiers de doléances* (n = 1800) to capture the political views at the local level, industries, imports and exports (in collaboration with the project TOFLIT18), and prices. I also use personal diaries from different social classes to complete my statistical analyzes and capture their experiences and views during the different crises.

In my dissertation, I show that we can not rely only on meteorological explanations and grain prices to explain why food riots occurred. Indeed, they are deeply linked - geographically and temporally - to trade shocks and the crisis that they provoked in the industrialization process. I also illustrate that communities



who experienced severe shocks and unemployment due to a slow-down in the industrial production were more willing to use violence and expressed radical political measures in their *cahiers de doléances* in 1789 such as protectionism, prohibition of new machines imported from England, or positions against the liberalization of the grain market.

During my PhD, I learned how to manage quantitative historical datasets and lead a statistical analysis by using R, datavizualization (sankey diagram, animated or interactive maps) geographical analysis with GIS, and tools to publish online databases: in collaboration with Cédric Chambru and the University of Caen-Normandy we are publishing an Historical Social Conflict Database (HiSCoD) containing more than 10 000 riots which will be available online in July 2020). I also developed several collaborations on different research projects with economists on real wages and living standards or with archeologists to understand the material production of goods during the first stages of industrialization.

In addition to seminars and courses followed at the University of Caen-Normandie or at the University of Geneva, I attended a post-graduate course on the “Antillean Plantation Complex” (with Paul Cheney at the University of Chicago, fall 2016).
