HEREBY DECREES AS FOLLOWS:

The Summer School in Smart Technologies and Practices for Sustainable Agricultural Water Management (Theory Module) will run for the academic year 2023/2024, starting on 15 April 2024. The coordinators are Prof. Daniele Masseroni and Prof. Arianna Facchi, both associate

professors in the scientific-disciplinary sector AGR/08 – Agricultural hydraulics and watershed protection.

Objectives

The Summer School aims to equip participants with theoretical knowledge regarding irrigation practices and innovative technologies for sustainable water management in agriculture. Several instructors are from outside of Italy, thus giving the Summer School an international dimension. This first edition of the Summer School has a dual focus: irrigation scheduling methods and tools on the one hand, surface irrigation and eco-hydrological implications on the other. Classes will explore surface irrigation techniques (e. g. flooding, basin irrigation, etc.) at field or farm scale, with insights on how better water management at field or farm scale can impact on the whole irrigation district/basin.

Course organisation

The course will take place from 15 April 2024 to 18 April 2024, at the University of Milan and online. It includes 16 hours of classes taught in English, on the following topics:

- Irrigation scheduling, surface irrigation, basin irrigation and managed aquifer recharge.

Upon completion of the course, students will be awarded 2 university credits (CFU/ECTS).

Attendance at the various activities of the Summer School is mandatory.

Application requirements

environmental planning; LM-60 Natural sciences; LM-66 Computer systems safety; LM-69 Agriculture; LM-73 Environmental and forestry sciences; LM-74 Geology; LM-75 Environmental and land sciences; LM-79 Geophysics; LM-80 Geography.

Students enrolled in other Bachelor's and Master's programmes and graduates in other disciplines may also be admitted, subject to an assessment by the competent bodies of the Summer School.

English proficiency at B1 level is required.

Applications by candidates who studied abroad will be assessed by the Admission Board, in compliance with the regulations in force in Italy and in the country where candidates pursued their studies.

Selection process

A maximum of 50 students can enrol in the course. The Summer School will not run if the number of enrolled students is less than 30. Participants will be selected on 13 March 2024, based on an assessment of their CV (maximum 2 pages).

Enrolment fee

Candidates admitted to the Summer School are required to pay an enrolment fee of €316.00 (including the insurance premium and a €16.00 stamp duty), by the enrolment date.

Application for admission

Applications for admission must be submitted by 11.59 pm on 4 March 2024, as follows:

- 1. Register on the University portal at <u>https://registrazione.unimi.it/</u>. Candidates already registered on the portal or in possession of University login credentials, such as students or graduates of the University of Milan, can skip this step;
- 2. Log in with your credentials and submit an application for admission to the Summer School using the online procedure available at https://studente.unimi.it/ammissioni/a/summerWinterSchool/checkLogin.asp;
- 3. Upload the following documents in .pdf, .jpg or .rtf format:

All candidates:

- CV (maximum 2 pages)
- In addition to the above, candidates enrolled at a foreign University or holding a foreign degree must also upload:
- A. University statement of enrolment or degree certificate;
- B. Translation of their degree into Italian or English (certificates written in Spanish, French or German will also be accepted).

Candidates who provide false data or fail to meet the requirements will be excluded from the course.

Failure to do so will result in exclusion from the Summer School. Moreover, they must pay the enrolment fee by credit card or using the payment notice issued by the online system, by the due date stated on the notice itself.

Candidates who are exempt from paying the enrolment fee must nonetheless pay the stamp duty.

As the Summer School is part of the University's institutional activities, no VAT is applied to the enrolment fee, and no invoice will be issued.

Late payment will be subject to a penalty fee of ≤ 30.00 (Regulations on Tuition and Fees, Waivers and Scholarships).

Candidates are advised to keep the payment receipt issued by the system, as it is valid for tax purposes.

Foreign candidates are required to provide a copy of their tax ID (*codice fiscale*) via the online enrolment procedure.

Withdrawal

Enrolled students who intend to withdraw from the course must fill the corresponding form available on the website and send it to the Student Office for PhD, Vocational Masters, State Exams and Post-Graduate Programmes <u>via the InformaStudenti online platform</u>, choosing the category Postgraduate>Advanced programmes.

If withdrawal occurs prior to the actual start of the Summer School, any fees paid will be reimbursed, minus an amount equal to 10% of the enrolment fee and in any case not lower than €100.00, which will be withheld to cover general and administrative costs. Studies cannot be interrupted for any reason whatsoever.

Certificate of attendance

At the end of the Summer School, a certificate of attendance will be issued to all students who fulfilled their obligations.
