## Call for applications to the Summer School in INTEGRATING TRADITIONAL AND DIGITAL APPROACHES IN MANUSCRIPT STUDIES (INTRADAMS) — AY 2025-2026

### THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE ACADEMICS AND TRAINING DIVISION

- Having regard to Presidential Decree no. 162 dated 10 March 1982, and in particular article 1, paragraph 2, point (c), and articles 16 and 17, pertaining to advanced courses;
- Having regard to art. 6 of Law no. 341 dated 19 November 1990;
- Having regard to Ministerial Decree no. 270 dated 22 October 2004, containing new rules governing the educational autonomy of Universities and replacing Ministerial Decree no. 509 dated 3 November 1999;
- Having regard to the Statute of the University of Milan, issued by Rector's Decree on 15 March 2012, as subsequently amended and supplemented;
- Having regard to the Academic Regulations of the University of Milan, issued by Rector's Decree no. 1208 dated 4 March 2020;
- Having regard to the Regulations for Master Programmes, Advanced Courses and Lifelong Learning, issued by Rector's Decree no. 1737 dated 23 April 2020 and replaced by the *Regolamento per l'Alta Formazione* (Regulations for continuous professional development), issued by Rector's Decree no. 4443 of 14 October 2025;
- Having regard to the resolutions passed by the Academic Senate, at its meeting of 11 November 2025, and by the Board of Directors, at its meeting of 2 December 2025, with which these academic bodies authorised the institution of the Summer School in INtegrating TRAditional and Digital Approaches in Manuscript Studies (INTRADAMS) for the AY 2025/2026

### HEREBY ESTABLISHES AS FOLLOWS:

The Summer School in INtegrating TRAditional and Digital Approaches in Manuscript Studies (INTRADAMS), organised in collaboration with the Department of History and Cultures of the University of Bologna, will run for the academic year 2025/2026, starting on 8 June 2026. The



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coordinators are Prof. Marta Luigina Mangini, associate professor in the scientific-disciplinary sector HIST-04/D Palaeography, and Dr. Giacomo Vignodelli, tenure track researcher in the scientific-disciplinary sector HIST-01/A Medieval History at the Department of History and Cultures of the University of Bologna.

## **Objectives**

The Summer School, organised in collaboration with the University of Rochester (New York, USA) and the Department of History and Cultures of the University of Bologna, aims to give historical, textual, graphic and material knowledge of books and documents, thanks to the interaction between historical, palaeographical, codicological and philological-textual exegesis on one hand, and computer-based data management and processing, digital diagnostics, applied physics and materials science on the other hand. Participants will discover the latest developments in the areas of palaeography, codicology, archiving, cataloguing and exegesis of sources, as well as techniques of physical analysis and image processing of cultural heritage. They will be able to apply such knowledge to develop innovative ways to explore, investigate, analyse and enhance the manuscript heritage. Course contents have been developed in collaboration with Biblioteca Trivulziana e Archivio Storico Civico (Milan), Biblioteca Ambrosiana (Milan), Fondazione Museo del Tesoro del Duomo e Archivio Capitolare (Vercelli) and Fondazione Biblioteca Capitolare di Verona.

## **Course organisation**

The course will take place **from 8 June 2026 to 19 June 2026** at the University of Milan. It includes 78 hours of lessons and exercises taught in English, divided as follows:

- Palimpsests as Historical Sources: The Methodological Challenge of Reused Writing Materials
- Overview of Recycled Medieval Diplomatic Fragments
- Historical Analysis of Palimpsest Manuscript Case Study
- Cataloguing Manuscript Fragments and Palimpsests. Methodologies and Ongoing Projects
- Codicological Analysis and Critical Edition of Palimpsests
- Multispectral Analysis Techniques for the Non-invasive Study of Different Writing Surfaces



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- Digital Approaches to Archival Studies
- Collaboration in Cultural Heritage Projects
- Forensic Codicology: Manuscripts, Materials, and Types of Damage
- Overview of Image Processing
- Overview of Multispectral Image Capture
- The Manuscript Heritage of the Biblioteca Ambrosiana in Milan and the Digital Tools for its Preservation and Usability
- The Capitular Library of Vercelli and its Heritage: a Story across History
- The Bergamo Palimpsests Project
- The Trivulziana Library and its Cultural Heritage: Public Access, Preservation and Research
- A Philological Journey into Illustrious and Less Illustrious Palimpsests
- Organizing Cultural Heritage Imaging Projects: Project Conceptualization, Management of Components and Partners, Achieving Deliverables
- Capturing and Image Processing of Manuscripts

The programme also includes two fully-funded field trips, i.e. a one-day trip to the Capitular Archive of Vercelli and a three-day trip to the Capitular Archive of Verona.

Upon completion of all activities, participants will be awarded 10 university credits (CFU/ECTS).

Attendance at the various activities of the Summer School is mandatory.

## Places available

A maximum of 25 students can enrol in the Summer School. The course will not run if the number of enrolled students is less than 20.

## Admission requirements

Applicants must hold a Bachelor's or Master's degree in one of the following degree classes pursuant to Ministerial Decree 270/2004: L-1 Cultural heritage; L-10 Humanities; L-30 Physics; L-31 Computer science; L-42 History; L-43 Diagnostics for the conservation of cultural heritage;



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LM-5 Library studies; LM-11 Science for conservation of cultural heritage; LM-14 Modern philology; LM-15 Ancient philology, literature and history; LM-17 Physics; LM-18 Computer science; LM-43 Information technology methods for the humanities; LM-84 History.

Applicants holding other Bachelor's or Master's degrees may also be admitted, subject to an assessment by the competent bodies of the Summer School.

Applicants must be proficient in English at level B2 (no language certificate is needed).

Applications by applicants who studied abroad will be assessed by the Admission Board, in compliance with the regulations in force in Italy and in the country where applicants pursued their studies.

## **Selection process**

Applicants will be selected on the basis of their CV and a cover letter of no more than 250 words, written in English, in which they will have to outline:

- their experience in the study of manuscripts using traditional methods (e. g. palaeography, codicology, diplomatics, philology etc.);
- their experience in the study of manuscripts using digital methods;
- their learning expectations (if they have no experience in the above-mentioned disciplines);
- any current or future research project to which they hope to apply the course contents.

**Applicants must submit their cover letter and CV in English by 26 February 2026, following the instructions specified in the section "Applications for Admission".**

The Admission Board will meet for the selection process on **13 March 2026**.

## **Enrolment fee**

Applicants admitted to the Summer School are required to pay an enrolment fee of **€786.00** (including the insurance premium and a **€16.00** stamp duty), by the enrolment date.



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## **Enrolment fee waiver for applicants with disabilities**

Students with a disability at or above 66% and/or a recognised handicap (art. 3, paragraphs 1 and 3 of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992) are only required to pay the stamp duty in the amount of €16.00. Payment is to be made **online** after completing the enrolment procedure.

## **University residences**

The University of Milan offers accommodation in its student residences for a total of €280.00 for two weeks. **Students wishing to book accommodation will have to write a message via InformaStudenti, selecting the category Postgraduate > Advanced courses, lifelong learning, summer/winter schools.**

#### **Applicants holding a foreign degree:**

Applicants who provide false data or fail to meet the requirements will be excluded from the Summer School.

#### **Applicants holding a foreign degree**

Applicants who have obtained their degree from a foreign university must comply with the same admission procedures and deadlines as the other applicants.

Moreover they are required to upload the following documents:

- Degree certificate
- Translation of their degree into Italian or English

Certificates written in Spanish, French or German will also be accepted.

Such publication serves as official notice. Therefore, no personal communication will be sent out to applicants.

Admitted applicants are required to enrol **between 19 March 2026 and 26 March 2026** at the following link:

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Failure to do so will result in exclusion from the Summer School. Moreover, they must pay the enrolment fee by credit card or using the payment notice issued by the online system, by the due date stated on the notice itself.

Applicants who are exempt from paying the enrolment fee must nonetheless pay the stamp duty.

As the Summer School is part of the University's institutional activities, no VAT is applied to the enrolment fee, and no invoice will be issued.

Late payment will be subject to a penalty fee of €30.00 (Regulations on Tuition and Fees, Waivers and Scholarships).

Applicants are advised to keep the payment receipt issued by the system, as it is valid for tax purposes.

Foreign applicants are required to provide a copy of their tax ID (*codice fiscale*) via the online enrolment procedure.

## Withdrawal

Enrolled students who intend to withdraw from the Summer School must fill the corresponding form available on the website and send it to the Student Office for PhD, Vocational Masters and Advanced Courses via [Login to online services](#), choosing the category Postgraduate > Advanced courses, lifelong learning, summer/winter schools.

If withdrawal occurs prior to the actual start of the Summer School, any fees paid will be reimbursed, minus an amount equal to 10% of the enrolment fee and in any case not lower than €100.00, which will be withheld to cover general and administrative costs. Studies cannot be interrupted for any reason whatsoever.

## Certificate of attendance

At the end of the Summer School, a certificate of attendance will be issued to all students who fulfilled their obligations.

## Further information and data protection
