### Research groups; projects and research development in the "third mission"

- In 2017, I was part of the research team of the "Digital Rights and Governance in Australia and Asia" project, which received funding through a competitive grant from the University of Sydney under the Sydney Research Excellence Initiative. I actively participated in the research activities of the University of Sydney's research group, and in my role, I contribute to organising an international workshop, which took place on 18 August 2017.

In addition to the design of the survey, I was responsible for training the local staff to administer the survey and quantitatively analyse the data with statistical software.
