# TRAINING OR RESEARCH ACTIVITY

My work draws on approaches from South Asian studies to investigate the interaction of elite and local culture in the Roman Empire. Until now this has meant applying the anthropological model of the great and little tradition to the variety of cultural traditions thriving in the Roman world. Using this approach my Ph.D. thesis used archaeological, epigraphic, iconographic and literary evidence to detail the survival of local languages across the empire, local material culture in Britain and the Rhineland, and local Egyptian cults. In my Internationalisation Post.Doc. I extended this approach to examine the effect of the military on the survival and transformation of local culture, studying the effect of recruitment on society in the Rhineland and the effect of garrisons on that of Northern Britain. Having thus completed an anthropological survey of Roman provincial culture through examinations of both civilian and military cases, my future research will shift towards the study of Roman imperial culture. I have received instruction in reading epigraphy from Dr. Christian Thomsen, and I am proficient in reading Ancient Greek and Latin. I also have a working proficiency in German, French and Spanish.
