**First paper: Age and Food Security in Pre- and Post-COVID-19:**

This study leverages data from the Ethiopian Socio-Economic Survey and high-frequency phone surveys to investigate the intersection of age and food security in Ethiopia, both before and after the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic using Pseudo Panel data modeling. With a focus on the concept of aging akin to fine wine, the research aims to discern the resilience and well-being of aging populations amidst socio-economic challenges. Through quantitative analysis of survey data, the study explores the dynamics of ageism and its implications on food security among older adults. By analyzing pre- and post-COVID-19 data, the research seeks to illuminate the evolving landscape of aging in Ethiopia, shedding light on potential disparities, coping mechanisms, and areas for policy intervention. The study uses the data for the available projects of the Chinese companies and industries through Road and Belt project and their impacts on the aged section of the Ethiopia societies.

## Second paper: Trust and Forced Migration in the Time of COVID-19 Crisis: The case of Ethiopia

This study investigates the role of trust in the integration of refugee populations during the COVID-19 pandemic in Ethiopia. Data is sourced from the Ethiopian High Frequency Phone survey round -1, while round -2 is excluded due to numerous missing values in the main variable of interest. Employing binary logit and ordered logit or probit models, the research analyzes refugees' trust in government, host communities, and aid distribution networks, and its impact on their fears and sense of safety. Preliminary descriptive findings reveal diverse demographic profiles among refugees and varying levels of trust between communities and institutions. The study emphasizes the significance of trust-building initiatives and positive community relationships in fostering integration and support. The expected outcomes of this paper aim to address a policy gap by advocating for comprehensive integration programs, reinforced legal protections, and equitable aid distribution mechanisms to enhance trust-building efforts. Consequently, multi-stakeholder collaboration becomes imperative for effective interventions to meet the needs of forced migrant populations during crises.

Using a mixed research design, we conducted interviews and surveys in Butajira, Wolkite, Gubre, and Agena, involving five companies and 464 households. Our findings highlight the importance of effective communication, prudent management, and risk mitigation for success. Leveraging geographic advantages and addressing electricity stability emerged as critical factors. In conclusion, our analysis underscores the need for tailored support, infrastructure enhancement, and business advisory services to foster SME growth and sustainability. We recognize the significance of partnerships, government support, and the dominance of manufacturing in this context. Continuous training for entrepreneurs is essential, while collaborative efforts are crucial for creating a supportive business environment. We recommend future research to utilize panel data surveys for extended regression analysis.
