## Research supervision

Due to my international standing in Hegel studies and history of thought, I have recruited and am supervising five PhD students, three of which are funded. I successfully supervised one Ph.D, (2016) and two M.Phil (2014, 2017) to timely completion. My PhD student published a paper in an international peer-reviewed journal before graduation and his monograph will be published this year. I have co-supervised PGR students in Politics and Sociology and have examined two PhDs and one M.Phil.

Engaged by a medical registrar at Freeman hospital, Prof. David Deehan, to discuss patient duties with an eye to policy engagement culminating in a journal article which has been cited at national NHS policy discussions. In the past five years, I have been invited to provide a public
