1. BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMME

The Erasmus Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) is a new short-term intensive mobility option envisaged by the new Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme. Using innovative teaching and learning approaches, it offers an international experience that combines short-term physical mobility with a mandatory virtual component.

Description	This project aims to translate key documents of the 4EU+ Alliance from English into five languages, namely Czech, German, French, Italian, and Polish. The project will therefore strengthen the institutional multilingualism of the Alliance, while also making its central documentation more easily accessible. The translation project is primarily aimed at MA students and will be held as a blended Joint Course. It consists of a 5-day work meeting in Paris (6- 10 October 2025) as well as 2 hours of classes per week at the respective partner universities and regular online meetings with other participants. The students



will be divided into several working groups based on different tasks (e. g. terminology management, quality assurance, technical localization issues) and can receive 3 ECTS. The project therefore allows the students to gain valuable practical experience in several translation-related areas. It furthermore allows them to participate in an international collaborative project in the framework they can benefit from and network with peers and lecturers from several partner universities.

3. WHO CAN APPLY

1. Be regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the academic year 2025/2026 (Languages and Cultures for Communication and International Cooperation (LIN), European and Non-European Languages and Literatures)
2. Have passed a (specialised) translation exam in English or German
3. Be up to date with university tuition fees
4. Not be receiving any other EU funding from other programmes/actions financed by the European Union for stays abroad that overlap, even partially, with the Erasmus+ BIP period
5. Have a level of English equal to C1 (CEFR) or higher

4. APPLICATION

To apply, register on the [elixForms platform](#) by **September 12th 2025, 2 pm.**

The following documentation is required:

- 1) A paragraph explaining the reasons for the application in relation to the BIP's learning objectives (to be entered in the appropriate field of the online application form);
- 2) **Signed** CV and copy of ID (PDF/A file; max 5 MB);
- 3) **Signed** Self-certified transcript of records (to be printed from Unimia as a PDF/A file; max 5 MB);
- 4) An official English language certification (minimum C1 level) [recognised](#) by the University and obtained no more than five years before the time of application (the list of recognized certifications is available at <https://www.unimi.it/en/study/language-proficiency/other-foreign-languages-tests-and-courses>) or a language proficiency statement obtained through the University Language Centre, obtained no more than five years before the time of application. If the level of the language needed for the application expressly appears on the Unimia career, it is possible to submit a screenshot of it in pdf-format.

5. SELECTION PROCESS

A Rector-appointed board will select up to 4 students on the following criteria:

- a) Academic career and CV (up to 5 points);
- b) Language skills (up to 10 points);
- c) Candidate's motivation (up to 5 points).
- d) Grade in a MA Translation exam and Language skills in English and/or German (up to 10) points

6. SCHOLARSHIPS

Selected students will be granted an individual BIP mobility grant of €79 per day. Students with fewer opportunities may receive an additional contribution of € 100/day (for a 5-14-day period of physical mobility). All admitted students who will complete the physical and virtual mobility programme will be eligible to these grants.

7. PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING
