QUICK APPLICATION GUIDE THESIS ABROAD CALL 2025/2026 – 1ST EDITION

Objective

If you are writing your Master's thesis and would like to conduct part of your research abroad, this scholarship is for you!

Eligibility requirements

- 1. Be enrolled in a Master's degree program or a single-cycle Master's degree program.
- 2. Plan to graduate by the first graduation session of the 2026/2027 academic year (May–July 2027).
- 3. Have a good GPA (check the file with the minimum required GPA on the website: unimi.it \rightarrow Studying Abroad \rightarrow Thesis Abroad).
- 4. Have at least a B1 level of proficiency in the language you will use abroad

How much is the grant worth?

- €800 per month (for up to 5 months).
- The minimum stay is 2 months, the maximum is 5 months (an extension up to 9 months can be requested, but without extra funding).
- The grant is paid in a single instalment on the La Statale Card.

How to apply

By 1 December 2025, 2:00 PM, you must:

- 1. Fill out the online application form at this link: Online form
- Upload the following documents in PDF format:
- Acceptance letter signed by both your supervisor and the foreign university (use the "Annex B" template).
- B1 language certificate or SLAM certificate or self-certification (see details below).
- Reference letter from your thesis supervisor.
- Screenshot of your GPA from Unimia (your student ID number must be visible).
- Thesis project (use the "Annex A" template), signed by your supervisor and the foreign tutor.
- A short personal motivation statement (to be written directly in the form).

How to prove your language level

- Official certificate recognised by UNIMI (issued within the past 5 years).
- SLAM B1 certificate.
- Screenshot from Unimia if your language level is already listed there.
- For English: if your degree program is taught in English, you may self-certify using "Annex C".

How is your application evaluated?

The committee assigns a maximum of 30 points, distributed as follows:

- Thesis project: up to 15 points
- GPA above the minimum threshold: up to 6 points
- Language skills: up to 4 points
- Motivation: up to 5 points

You need at least 21 points to be considered eligible.

After being selected

- You will receive instructions via email.
- You must complete additional forms and, if required, apply for a visa.
- You cannot change your host institution after the grant is awarded.
- After returning, you must upload online:
 - Certificate of stay
 - Report from your thesis supervisor
 - Learning Agreement

If you change your mind

Notify the university within 5 days and return the grant (if already received, according to the instructions provided).
