# Important preliminary remarks...




Please note that we are waiting for the new Erasmus+ programme 2021-2027 to be launched: therefore, the following information may be subject to change with regard to its structure, rules or scholarships.

We will inform you as soon as the new guidelines to the programmes are released!



### 1. WHAT IS ERASMUS+?



### THE ERASMUS+ SCHOLARSHIP

- <u>EU grants</u> in 2020-21: published on the Call for information only
   → they will most probably change with the new Programme;
- The grant amount depends on the country and equals to either € 250 or € 300 / month;
- The University of Milan offers additional scholarships depending on students' income. You do not need to apply for this.

It is important to check whether any other scholarships you are awarded are compatible with the Erasmus scholarship (for instance, the *Excellence scholarship*). In case of incompatibility, you will have to choose which one to receive.



## 1. Who, when and for how long?

### WHO?

All UNIMI students duly enrolled for the academic year 2021-2022 in:

- Bachelor's, Master's and one-cycle degrees
- Doctoral Programmes
- Schools of specialization

...up to 1 year outside their prescribed time of study («primo anno fuori corso»)

### WHEN AND FOR HOW LONG?

- ➤ 3 months (minimum) to 12 months (maximum) according to the existing agreements (See Annex A);
- ➤ You must end your mobility by 30th September 2022









Online applications open on <u>5 February 2021 and close on 26 February 2021, at 13:00</u> (1pm)

#### How to take part in the programme

To take part in the Erasmus+ programme you must respond to the call for applications and present a general training programme, which may be completed at any one of the selected universities.

The call for applications, published each year in February, specifies the admission requirements, as well as application and selection procedures.

The following students may apply to the Erasmus+ programme:

- those enrolled on a degree programme, who have not been off track with exams for more than
  one year at the time of application
- those who have at least A2 level proficiency in the working language of the selected host
  university or in English, in the case of destination countries which use languages that are not
  widely spoken.

- CV (Europass suggested) + previous
  university carreer (the exams you took so
  far if enrolled in Bachelor's or Single Cycle
  course; exams taken so far + your previous
  Transcript of Records and degree if Master's
  student) One single PDF file max 5MB)\*
- Learning Agreement proposal (Form 1)\*
- Documents to prove your language skills (certificate/SLAM language proficiency statement/Screenshot of your Unimi career if it shows the level OR self-certification through Form 2 - as required in Annex A)-One single PDF file - Max10 MB \*

# 5. HOW TO APPLY Language requirements

You need to have at least A2 level of the language(s) of instruction at the desired institution(s) (CEFR) in order to apply.

<u>Depending on the course you are enrolled at, and according to the requirements in Annex A, you are required to either:</u>

1) Submit a language certificate/SLAM proficiency statement/Screenshot of your UNIMI career <u>if</u> language level is shown:

SLAM proficiency statement/s screenshot of level on career If you do not hold a certificate nor have passed any SLAM tests, remember to book a free test session as soon as possible!

Once you pass the exam, SLAM will issue a certificate. Tests are one-shot (only one test per language). If you have already passed a test with SLAM, you can upload a *screenshot* of your Unimi career to your application, as long as the level reached is clearly stated. If your level does not show, you can request the related statement to SLAM (Informastudenti> Test di lingua)

- 2) Upload the Self-certification (Form 2) stating the level of the language/s for the chosen destination. It/they will be tested by the Commission during your selection interview. Also, use Form 2 if you have to sit a Portuguese test with SLAM.
- > Students enrolled in degrees <u>entirely taught in English</u> are exempt from proving their English knowledge up to the entry level required for their course, but <u>still</u> have to self-declare their English knowledge (Form 2)

- ! Only exams registered on your UNIMI career by 2 March 2021 will count towards your final Erasmus Index Score.
- ! Please make sure all the exams you took are registered by this date!

#### Studying abroad with Erasmus+

Erasmus+ is an European Union programme that - for more than 30 years - allows students and graduating, doctoral and specialising students to enjoy study or training experiences abroad in over 300 different European partner universities, with the recognition of the activity abroad as part of their academic career.

Erasmus + aims at promoting the development of the European society giving students different opportunities to improve their knowledge of a foreign language, and to study and train abroad in intercultural contexts, as main goals of the programme.

During the mobility abroad, students are still enrolled at the University of Milan and do not have to pay any tuition fees to the host university, with the exeption of potential secretarial costs.

Erasmus+ mobility programme for students consists of:

- study periods, for attending courses, sitting exams or doing research for thesis or laboratory and clinical activities
- Traineeship periods, for educational training under the supervision of the hosting partner university, open also to graduated students (within 12 months from their graduation)

Students can candidate to Erasmus + mobility programme for a maximum of **12 months**, when enrolled in a degree or master degree programme, and for a maximum of **24 months**, when attending a single cycle master degree programme. Candidates can choose wether to use their Erasmus + mobility as a study or traineeship period abroad.

Swiss-European Mobility Programme

General requirements and the application procedure to Erasmus + programme are specified in the University's call for application.

Published annually, around February, the call for application relates to mobility periods to be completed during the consecutive academic year.
