REGULATIONS FOR THE AWARDING OF DEGREE MARKS

approved by the Managing Committee of the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences in its meeting of 24 February 2022 effective as of the first graduation session of the 2021-2022 academic year

INITIAL SCORING

The degree mark takes into account the student's weighted average exam grade, based on the number of credits for each course. The formula for calculating the average grade is as follows:

$$\frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n}(exam\ grade_{i}\times number\ of\ credits\ for\ exam_{i})}{total\ number\ of\ credits\ earned}\times\frac{110}{30}$$

For Bachelor's degrees only, honours have the following value for the purposes of calculating the candidate's initial average grade:

Value of honours 3 points (30 cum laude is equal to 33)

AWARDING OF HONOURS: honours may be awarded to students who reach 110/110, subject to the degree board's unanimous approval.

ADDITIONAL SCORING: BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Additional scores for writing and defending the final paper	Up to 6 points	The degree board may award up to 6 points for the final paper, including how it was defended
Additional scores for graduating on track	3 points	For students who graduate on track, in the first or second session (the score is calculated automatically by the Student Registrars and shown on the degree certificate)
	1 point	For students who graduate on track, in the third session (the score is calculated automatically by the Student Registrars and shown on the degree certificate)
Additional scores for international mobility (Erasmus+, Erasmus+ Traineeship, other activities as agreed with faculty members)	1 point	For students who graduate on track, in the first or second session, and have completed training activities abroad, as agreed with faculty members (Erasmus+, Erasmus+ Traineeship etc)
	2 points	For students who graduate on track, in the third session, and have completed training activities abroad, as agreed with faculty members (Erasmus+, Erasmus+ Traineeship etc)

ADDITIONAL SCORING: MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAMMES

The degree board may award a **up to 10 points** for the degree thesis and how it was defended, including 1 point for students who have completed training activities abroad, as agreed with faculty members (Erasmus+, Erasmus+ Traineeship etc...)
