ACADEMIC YEAR 2025/2026

Issued by Rector's Decree no. 27788/25 of 16 July 2025, file no. 3225/2025

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**CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR DSU ACCOMMODATION
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This is a call for applications for the allocation of accommodation under the education incentive programme (DSU – *Diritto allo Studio*) for the 2025/2026 academic year. This document governs:

- the first-time allocation of accommodation (new admissions)
- the allocation of accommodation to students who were already assigned an accommodation in the academic year 2024/2025 (returning students).

Article 1 – PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

Applications are open to those who are enrolled or intend to enrol in one of the following university programmes for the academic year 2025/2026:

- a) Bachelor's degree (3 years: first-level degree);
- b) Single-cycle Master's degree (5 or 6 years: combined first and second level degree);
- c) Master's degree (2 years: second-level degree);
- d) Postgraduate school (with the exception of medical residents with a specialist training contract);
- e) PhD programme (only for PhDs without scholarship/fellowship);
- f) filter semester of the Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine and Veterinary Medicine degree programmes (see art. 11)

(N.B.: As per article 2, paragraph 1 of Ministerial Decree 447 of 11 July 2025, no subsidised student accommodation is provided during the filter semester).

Applicants must also meet all the following eligibility requirements:

- a) be **under 27 years of age on 1 January 2025**, unless they are returning students (i.e. they were already allocated accommodation in the previous academic year);
- b) meet the **merit requirements** indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2025/2026;
- c) meet the **income requirements** indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2025/2026;
- d) be **non-resident students**, i.e. they must reside in municipalities from where it is IMPOSSIBLE to reach the course location with public transport in less than **90 minutes**.

The travel time to be calculated is **the minimum travel time** by public transport from the departure station/stop (residence) to the arrival station/stop (course location), including any waiting times at intermediate stops. Routes on foot or by private means of transport are excluded from the calculation.

The Residence Hall Office will check the travel times declared by students against the routes proposed by the Lombardy Region's website www.muoversi.regione.lombardia.it/ between 7 and 9 in the morning.

Eligibility requirements must be met on the closing date for applications and must be maintained for the whole academic year 2025/2026.

The University also accepts applications from students who have an ISEE University value higher than €26,516.70 and up to €40,000.00, plus an ISPE University value not exceeding 75,000.00, provided that they meet the merit requirements under article 4 of the call for regional scholarships. These applications will be taken into consideration only if there are still places available after all eligible applicants have been assigned an accommodation, based on the ranking criteria outlined in article 4 of this call. In that case, students with the above mentioned ISEE and ISPE values will be required to pay the fee for short-term housing for the allocated accommodation.

The following categories **are not eligible**:

- 1) students who are hired on a permanent contract (full-time or part-time);
- 2) students who are hired on a fixed-term contract requiring them to work more than 20 hours per week;
- 3) students who own a VAT-registered business;
- 4) students who hold more than a 10% share in a company or partnership;
- 5) students who already hold a university degree of a level equal to or higher than the one for which they are now applying for accommodation, or students who are enrolled on a shortened degree programme (transfer students admitted to subsequent years)
- 6) students who have previously taken up accommodation for the same year of the programme for which they are now submitting an application for accommodation;
- 7) part-time students;
- 8) students enrolled in the online degree programme Computer Systems and Networks Security;
- 9) students who graduate no later than in the second graduation session of the academic year 2024/2025 (even if they have renewed enrolment in the academic year 2025/2026);
- 10) students who have been selected for an international mobility programme lasting for a number of months equal to or higher than the number of months for which they have been allocated accommodation;
- 11) students who are in arrears on payments or have failed to fulfil any obligations towards the University.

Article 2 – PLACES AVAILABLE: RETURNING STUDENTS AND NEW ADMISSIONS

The University will allocate a total of 1,115 places, to be divided between returning students and new admissions:

* These accommodations will be allocated preferentially to students of the Lodi campus.

The provisional number of places set aside for **returning students** is 700. These places will be allocated in the first instance to students who were already allocated accommodation in the academic year 2024/2025, provided that they meet the requirements specified in art. 1 of this call and:

- have renewed enrolment in the academic year 2025/2026; or
- intend to enrol in the first year of a Master's degree programme for the a. y. 2025/2026, but on the date of publication of the final ranking, as referred to in article 4.3 herein, have not obtained their Bachelor's degree yet.

These students must have submitted an application for admission into a Master's degree programme before the application deadline for this call. They must NOT renew enrolment into the Bachelor's degree programme. In this case, the accommodation will be allocated provisionally and will be confirmed only if the student finalises enrolment into the Master's degree programme by the applicable enrolment deadline, as stated in the corresponding call for applications. Students who fail to finalise enrolment by the deadline will be required to move out of the assigned accommodation and pay the fee for short-term housing for the whole duration of their stay.

The provisional number of places set aside for **new admissions** is 415. The exact number of places available for new admissions will be determined at the end of the procedure for allocating accommodation to returning students from the academic year 2024/2025.

Places reserved for new admissions will be allocated as follows: 2/3 to first-year students, and 1/3 to subsequent-year students.

In accordance with the provisions of the Decree no. 21650 dated 13 November 2002 of the Director General for Education, Training and Employment of the Lombardy Region, the total number of accommodation places for **new admissions** will be allocated as follows:

- 67% of places to EU students;
- 33% of places to non-EU students.

N.B.: Places available at Residenza Cascina Codazza in Lodi are reserved for students of the Lodi campus who appear as "eligible" in the ranking lists for the allocation of DSU scholarships (both returning students and new admissions).

Should the number of reserved places exceed the number of eligible students, the remaining places will be assigned, on a priority basis and as short-term housing (see art. 9.4), to students of the Lodi campus who have expressed their interest in this regard. **Expressions of interest** must be sent **by 26 September 2025** via <https://informastudenti.unimi.it> / Fees and Benefits / Accommodations / Expression of interest – Cascina Codazza. Should there still be vacant lodgings, these may be assigned as short-term housing to students enrolled in other degree programmes that are not based at the Lodi Campus.

Article 3 – HOW TO APPLY AND DEADLINE

3.1 – How to apply

Applications for accommodation must be submitted via the Online Helpdesk at <https://studente.unimi.it/dirittoallostudio/>.

In order to log in, you have to:

- use your university username and password OR
- register to the University portal at https://registrazione.unimi.it/reg_utenti_esterni/registrazione/form.html and then enter your registration credentials (N.B.: if you already have a University account, or have already registered on the portal to apply for admission or for other services, you must use the credentials you already have).

After checking your personal data and completing any missing information about your enrolment, go to "Choice of Benefits" and proceed as follows:

- 1) select "University accommodations";
- 2) enter the requested data regarding income, merit and other statements;
- 3) indicate the halls of residence where you would like to be accommodated, in top-down order, starting from your preferred option (new admissions only); students of the Lodi campus can only select Residenza Cascina Codazza in Lodi;
- 4) once the application is complete, confirm it and submit it.

You will then receive a confirmation of the application submission at the email address you used to log in, with a summary of all benefits requested for the a. y. 2025/2026.

N.B.: each student can only submit ONE APPLICATION. Students who submit multiple applications by registering more than once will be automatically excluded from the ranking.

Applications cannot be modified or cancelled once submitted.

3.2 – Deadline for applying for accommodation and submitting income documents

Applications for accommodation must be **submitted between 18 July and 21 August 2025** (23.59 GMT+2), following the procedures described in art. 3.1.

N.B.: Applicants must sign the Single Substitute Statement for their University ISEE certificate and send their income documents (in the cases contemplated under article 5.4 of the call for regional scholarships) by the closing date of this call (21 August 2025).

Applications that are incomplete, have not been confirmed or do not contain all the required documents **will be disregarded**. The same will happen for duplicate applications. Applicants will also be excluded from the rankings if they upload invalid documents or submit the required documents after 21 August 2025 (i.e. the closing date of this call).

Applications from students who are in arrears on payments will also be discarded.

Article 4 – RANKING LISTS AND PUBLICATION

4.1 – Ranking procedures and criteria

Based on the income and merit requirements indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2025/2026, the University will draw up five different rankings;

- a) returning students who were already allocated accommodation in the academic year 2024/2025;
- b) new admissions of **EU students** enrolled in the **first year** of Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools;
- c) new admissions of **non-EU students** enrolled in the **first year** of Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools;
- d) new admissions of **EU students** enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools **in years subsequent to the first**;
- e) new admissions of **non-EU students** enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools **in years subsequent to the first**.

Eligible students with a disability at or above 66% or a recognised handicap pursuant to article 3, paragraphs 1 and 3 of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 take precedence over other applicants.

N.B.: students cannot choose the type of room they are assigned.

The University will take into account students' preferences regarding the hall of residence in which they would like to be accommodated, but positioning in the ranking will be the only criterion used for allocating accommodation places. Therefore, students may be accommodated in their first-choice hall of residence, second-choice hall of residence and so on, depending on their position in the relevant ranking.

4.2 – Provisional rankings: publication and appeals

Provisional rankings will be published **on 29 August 2025 after 14.00** on the [Online Helpdesk](#).

Each ranking will show **eligible students** (i.e. those who meet the requirements for accommodation) and **non-eligible students** (i.e. those who do not meet the requirements for accommodation).

Non-eligible students may lodge an appeal **by 2 September 2025 (23.59 GMT+2)**.

The appeal must be lodged via the [Online Helpdesk](#) (under Rankings > Appeal the decision) and must include supporting documents that can serve as evidence of the applicant's claim of eligibility. Students may not appeal if their ineligibility is due to failure to comply with any deadline or requirement specified in this call for applications. Students will be notified of the outcome of their appeal when the final rankings are published.

4.3 – Final rankings

The final rankings, as described in art. 4.1., will be published in the [Online Helpdesk](#) according to the following schedule:

- **Returning students:**
8 September 2025 after 14.00
- **New admissions:**
12 September 2025 after 14.00

Each ranking will show the names of **beneficiaries** (students who HAVE BEEN allocated accommodation), **eligible students** (those who have NOT been allocated accommodation despite meeting the requirements specified in this call; they may become beneficiaries in the event of a ranking update, as per art. 5.3) and **non-eligible students** (students who do not meet the requirements).

BENEFICIARIES must accept or decline the accommodation offer by the deadline specified in art. 5 below, by following the procedures described in the same article.

Article 5 – ALLOCATION OF ACCOMMODATION TO BENEFICIARIES

To **accept the accommodation offer**, applicants who appear as **beneficiaries** in the relevant ranking must log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and follow the ranking-specific instructions specified below.

5.1 – Returning students: deadlines and allocation of accommodation

Between 8 and 10 September 2025, returning students who appear as beneficiaries in the final ranking are required to log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and either **accept** or **decline** the accommodation offer.

To ACCEPT the accommodation offer, you have to do the following (please note that you also need to be regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the a. y. 2025/2026):

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "accept";
- c) **confirm that you are enrolled** in the academic year 2025/2026 and specify your matriculation number;
- d) accept the accommodation offer and agree to the terms and conditions set out in the letter of commitment to pay the fees due (see article 9 of this call);
- e) **pay the €260 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance**. This amount is a down payment on the total accommodation fees due for the academic year in question.

Returning students who intend to enrol into a Master's degree programme, but **as of 11 September 2025** have not yet finalised enrolment, will be allocated a place in the halls of residence provisionally. Their place will be confirmed once they finalise enrolment into the Master's degree programme, provided that they do so by the applicable enrolment deadline, as specified in the call for applications.

Students who fail to finalise enrolment into the Master's degree by the relevant deadline will be required to leave the assigned accommodation and pay the fee for short-term housing for the whole duration of their stay.

At the end of the acceptance procedure, a letter of admission will be sent to your university email address. You must present this letter to the director of the assigned hall of residence, together with an ID, in order to check in.

Students who do not check in at the assigned hall of residence by the applicable deadline will forfeit their accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee.

To DECLINE the accommodation offer, please follow the steps below:

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "decline".

N. B.: there will be NO EXTENSION of the deadline. Returning students selected as beneficiaries who fail to accept the offer and to sign the letter of commitment by the deadline will lose their right to accommodation and will have to vacate their accommodation no later than 30 September 2025.

5.2 – New admissions: deadlines and allocation of accommodation

The number of new admissions will be determined based on the number of places available after returning students have accepted/declined their offers. These places will be divided between EU first-year students, non-EU first-year students and subsequent-year students, and allocated to applicants who have placed high enough in the relevant ranking.

It is the student's responsibility to view the rankings published in the [Online Helpdesk](#), as well as any related communications.

This online publication serves as official notice; students will not receive any personal email.

Between 12 and 15 September 2025, students who appear as beneficiaries in the final ranking are required to log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and either **accept** or **decline** the accommodation offer.

Places are allocated based on the ranking order and taking into account the preferences expressed by students in their application. Students cannot ask to change their allocated accommodation.

To ACCEPT the accommodation offer, you have to do the following (please note that you also need to be regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the a. y. 2025/2026):

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "accept";
- c) **confirm that you are enrolled** in the academic year 2025/2026 and specify your matriculation number;
- d) accept the accommodation offer and agree to the terms and conditions set out in the letter of commitment to pay the fees due (see article 6 of this call);
- e) **pay the €260 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance**. This amount is a down payment on the total accommodation fee.

Students who have applied for accommodation but have not yet matriculated will be allocated a place in the halls of residence provisionally. Their place will be confirmed once they finalise enrolment in a degree programme of the University of Milan, provided that they do so by 30 September 2025.

If they fail to finalise enrolment, these students will be required to leave the assigned accommodation and pay the fee for short-term housing for the whole duration of their stay.

At the end of the acceptance procedure, a letter of admission will be sent to your university email address. You must present this letter to the director of the assigned hall of residence, together with an ID, in order to check in.

Students who do not check in the assigned hall of residence by the applicable deadline will forfeit their accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee.

N. B.: there will be NO EXTENSION of the deadline.

Students who fail to accept the accommodation offer by the relevant deadline will forfeit their accommodation.

Please note that acceptance is FINAL. Students who have accepted the accommodation offer **may not, in any case, ask for a change of accommodation** (neither in the same hall of residence, nor in another one).

To DECLINE the accommodation offer, please follow the steps below:

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "decline".

N.B.: students who neither accept nor decline the offer by the deadline will be deemed as having declined the offer. **In no case may students accept the offer after the deadline.**

Article 6 – RANKING UPDATES FOR NEW ADMISSIONS

If a beneficiary student declines or fails to accept the accommodation offer, **their place will be allocated to the next eligible student in the relevant ranking** (by following the procedure described in art. 5.2) and the ranking will be updated accordingly.

Ranking updates will be published in the [Online Helpdesk](#), until all the places have been allocated. New beneficiaries must accept or decline the accommodation offer during the time windows specified below:

- first ranking update: from 17 to 19 September 2025 (23.59 GMT+2);
- second ranking update: from 24 to 26 September 2025 (23.59 GMT+2).

Should there still be places available after the second update, the University will update the rankings on a weekly basis. These updates will be published in the [Online Helpdesk](#).

Article 7 – ACCOMMODATION PERIOD

The accommodation periods for the academic year 2025/2026 are:

- a) for returning students: from 1 October 2025 to 30 September 2026;
- b) for returning students who are enrolled in their first year off track (so-called *primo anno fuori corso*): from 1 October 2025 to 31 March 2026;
- c) for new students: from 1 October 2025 (or later, if they are allocated accommodation as a result of a ranking update) to 30 September 2026.

In August, all the halls of residence will be closed.

Article 8 – REQUEST TO CHANGE ACCOMMODATION (RETURNING STUDENTS ONLY)

Returning students who appear as beneficiaries are automatically allocated the same accommodation as the previous academic year.

These students may ask to be allocated another accommodation, by sending a request via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Request to change accommodation, between 22 and 25 August 2025 (23.59 GMT+2).

Requests to change accommodation will be accepted **based on the applicant's position in the final ranking of returning students, provided that there are still places available.**

Article 9 – ACCOMMODATION FEES AND PAYMENT METHODS

9.1 – Standard subsidised fee for students enrolled on track

For students enrolled on track, the following standard subsidised fees apply:

- **Returning students:** €2,760.00 per year (1 October 2025 - 30 September 2026).

The fee is to be paid as follows:

- a) €260 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €750 (first instalment) by 15 January 2026;
- c) €750 (second instalment) by 15 April 2026;
- d) €1,000 (third instalment) by 15 June 2026;

- **New admissions:** €2,760.00 per year (1 October 2025 - 30 September 2026).

The fee is to be paid as follows:

- a) €260 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €750 (first instalment) by 15 January 2026;
- c) €750 (second instalment) by 15 April 2026;
- d) €1,000 (third instalment) by 15 June 2026, or by 15 September 2026 for first-year students.

All payments must be made via pagoPA at https://studente.unimi.it/fo_pagamenti/.

All instalments must be paid by the relevant deadline specified above. For recipients of regional scholarships, this is also necessary to maintain non-resident status. There will be no deadline extensions.

Students who fail to pay any instalment by the relevant deadline will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it, but they will still have to pay the standard subsidised fee for the whole academic year. For scholarship recipients, any amount due will be withheld from the scholarship. Students who are not scholarship recipients will be required to pay any outstanding amounts upon vacating their accommodation.

9.2 – Standard subsidised fee for students enrolled in the first year off track

The standard subsidised fee for students enrolled in their first year off track is €1,510.00 for the period from 1 October 2025 to 31 March 2026, to be paid in two instalments:

- a) €260 reservation fee to be paid within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €1,250 to be paid by 15 January 2026.

All payments must be made via pagoPA at https://studente.unimi.it/fo_pagamenti/.

All instalments must be paid by the relevant deadline specified above. For recipients of regional scholarships, this is also necessary to maintain non-resident status.

There will be no deadline extensions.

Students who fail to pay any instalment by the relevant deadline will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it, **but they will still have to pay the standard subsidised fee** for the whole academic year. For scholarship recipients, any amount due will be withheld from the scholarship. Students who are not scholarship recipients will be required to pay any outstanding amounts within a month of vacating their accommodation.

For students enrolled in their first year off track who have been allocated accommodation and are beneficiaries of a DSU regional scholarship, on-time payment of all instalments is necessary to maintain non-resident status.

Students who are enrolled in their first year off track and **do not graduate by the third session** of the academic year 2024/2025 may request to stay in the same accommodation from 1 April to 30 July 2026 upon payment of the fee for short-term housing (see article 9.4 of this call).

This request for extension must be submitted via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Extension of stay for off-track students. If the request is accepted, the student will be required to pay the whole amount due for the entire duration of the extension, even if they decide to move out of the accommodation earlier.

9.3 – Reductions on the standard subsidised fee

By signing the letter of commitment upon acceptance, students commit to paying the whole amount due, no matter how long they actually stay in the accommodation. Should they decide to move out before the end of the accommodation period, the Residence Hall Office will accept their request to move out earlier only once they have paid all outstanding amounts. This applies also to students who withdraw from their studies. The only exception to this rule is for students taking part in an international mobility programme, as provided for in art. 10, point b) below.

9.4 – Fee for short-term housing for students

The fee for short-term housing, as referred to in this call for applications, amounts to €400 for a double room and €450 for a single room per month.

Article 10 – MOVING OUT OF ACCOMMODATION

Students who have accepted an accommodation offer are to live in the assigned hall of residence for the whole accommodation period. If they decide to move out of the accommodation earlier, they must notify the Residence Hall Office and wait for their authorisation before vacating their accommodation.

The request for authorisation to move out earlier must be submitted via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Authorisation to move out, in all the following cases:

a) The student is moving out temporarily for more than 10 days

Students who wish to move out of the assigned residence temporarily, but for more than 10 days, must notify the Residence Hall Office **at least 7 days before leaving**. The Residence Hall Office will authorise the students to move out within 5 days of receipt of the request.

b) The student is moving out to participate in an international mobility programme

Students who have been allocated accommodation and are to participate in an international mobility programme in the academic year 2025/2026 must notify the Residence Hall Office **at least 15 days before** the start of their stay abroad.

Students will be exempted from paying accommodation fees (see art. 9), provided that their stay is documented by an ad-hoc form issued by the International Mobility and Promotion Office, and by a paid lease agreement signed in the mobility destination country. **Before leaving, students must remove all personal belongings from the accommodation.** At the end of their mobility programme, students must give **at least 15 days' notice** of their return by sending a message via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations. To this message, they must attach proof of the lease instalments paid abroad, plus the certificate of stay. The Residence Hall Office will then accommodate them in the same place as before.

- c) **The student is moving out because of withdrawal from studies or transfer to another University**
Students who decide to withdraw from studies or transfer to another University must give **at least 7 days' notice**. The Residence Hall Office will reply within 5 days, after checking if there are any outstanding payments.
- d) **The student is moving out earlier for personal reasons**
Students who wish to move out before the end of the accommodation period for personal reasons must give **at least 7 days' notice**. The Residence Hall Office will notify the student of any amounts due and authorise the student to move out within 7 days of the request, once all outstanding payments have been settled.

Students who are in arrears on payments will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it. Upon moving out, they will also be required to settle any outstanding amounts; in the case of scholarship recipients, any amount due will be withheld from the scholarship.

Article 11 – FORFEITING ACCOMMODATION

The following students will forfeit accommodation:

- 1) those who fail to accept the accommodation offer by the applicable deadline specified herein;
- 2) those who are not regularly enrolled in the academic year 2025/2026;
- 3) those who have registered the assigned hall of residence as their permanent residence address, or do so over the course the academic year;
- 4) those who submit false declarations to the University of Milan: in this case, the sanctions set out in art. no. 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/ 2000 will be applied;
- 5) those who receive disciplinary sanctions for breaching University Regulations: in this case, the student must nevertheless pay the full annual or six-month fee, regardless of the date of forfeiture;
- 6) those in arrears with any payment due to the University.

Article 12 – STUDENTS ATTENDING THE FILTER SEMESTER WHO ARE TO MATRICULATE INTO THE SECOND SEMESTER

- Students who have registered for the so-called "filter semester" at the University of Milan **must** follow the instructions specified herein to apply for accommodation. The application deadline is the same as for all other students.
- The previous point does not apply to students who have attended the filter semester at another University and, after the publication of the national rankings for admission into the degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine or Veterinary Medicine, decide to matriculate into the University of Milan. These students will be able to apply for accommodation **at a later time**. Between the end of January and mid-February 2026, the University will reopen the application window specifically for these students, to allow them to submit an application for accommodation.

Therefore, both the above-mentioned categories of students will not appear in the rankings referred to in art. 4 of this call for application. These students will be placed on a separate ranking ("DSU accommodation for second-semester students"), provided that they have taken all exams included the filter semester, no matter if successfully or not. The University will communicate the date of publication of this ranking in the notice announcing the reopening of the application window.

IMPORTANT

Students who have registered for the filter semester at the University of Milan and would like to attend September classes in person can request to be accommodated in one of the halls of residence for the period **from 1 September to 30 September 2025**, upon payment of the fee for short-term housing. The class schedule for September will be published at [Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine and Veterinary Medicine: admission and filter semester | University of Milan](#)).

The request must be submitted **between 15.00 on 26 July and 15.00 on 6 August 2025** by visiting <https://www.unimi.it/en/study/financial-support/accommodation/short-term-housing> and clicking on **Apply for short-term housing (temporary lodgings)**. To access the request form, please use the same University credentials that you received after enrolling in the filter semester.

The fee for short-term housing amounts to €400.00 for a double room and €450.00 for a single room per month.
