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CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR DSU ACCOMMODATION

ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027

Issued by Rector's Decree no. 27097/26 of 8 July 2026 (index no. 2891/2026)

This is a call for applications for the allocation of accommodation under the education incentive programme (DSU – *Diritto allo Studio*, i.e. right to higher education) for the academic year 2026/2027. This document governs:

- the first-time allocation of accommodation (new admissions) at subsidised DSU rates;
- the allocation of accommodation at subsidised DSU rates to students who were already assigned an accommodation in the academic year 2025/2026 (returning students);
- the allocation of accommodation at short-term housing rates, where applicable.

Article 1 – PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

Applications are open to those who are already enrolled or intend to enrol in one of the following university programmes for the academic year 2026/2027:

- a) Bachelor's degree (3 years: first-level degree);
- b) Single-cycle Master's degree (5 or 6 years: combined first and second-level degree);
- c) Master's degree (2 years: second-level degree);
- d) Postgraduate school (with the exception of medical residents with a specialist training contract);
- e) PhD programme (only for PhD students without scholarship/fellowship);
- f) open semester of the Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine and Veterinary Medicine degree programmes (see art. 12).

Applicants must also meet all the following eligibility requirements:

- a) be **under 27 years of age on 1 January 2026**, unless they are returning students (i.e. they were already allocated accommodation in the previous academic year);
- b) be non-resident students, i.e. they must reside in a municipality from which they **need more than 90 minutes to reach their campus** (commuting times are calculated exclusively with regard to public transport). The reference commuting times are available in the

Travel Time Table posted at <https://www.unimi.it/en/study/financial-support/accommodation/how-request-accommodation>;

- c) meet the **merit and academic progression requirements** indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2026/2027;
- d) meet the **income requirements** indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2026/2027.
The University also accepts applications from students who have an ISEE University higher than the maximum threshold, provided that they meet all other above-mentioned requirements. If there are still places available after all DSU eligible applicants have been assigned an accommodation based on the ranking criteria outlined in article 4 of this call, the remaining places will be allocated to applicants with an ISEE University above the threshold, in ranking order and at short-term housing rates (art. 9.3).

Eligibility requirements must be met on the closing date for applications and **must be maintained for the whole academic year 2026/2027.**

The following categories **are not eligible**:

- 1) students with a permanent **job contract** (full-time or part-time) or a fixed-term job contract requiring them to work more than 20 hours per week;
- 2) students who own a VAT-registered business;
- 3) students who hold more than a 10% share in a company or partnership;
- 4) students who already hold a university degree of a level equal to or higher than the one for which they are now applying for accommodation, or students who are enrolled on a shortened degree programme (i.e. students admitted to a year subsequent to the first);
- 5) repeating students (i.e. students who apply for accommodation for a programme year in which they have already been enrolled);
- 6) part-time students;
- 7) students enrolled in online degree programmes;
- 8) students who graduate no later than in the second graduation session of the academic year 2025/2026 (even if they have renewed enrolment in the academic year 2026/2027);
- 9) students who have been selected for an international mobility programme covering all the months for which they have been allocated accommodation;
- 10) students who are in arrears on payments or have failed to fulfil any obligations towards the University.

Article 2 – PLACES AVAILABLE: RETURNING STUDENTS AND NEW ADMISSIONS

The University will allocate a total of 1,345 places, to be divided between returning students and new admissions:

The provisional number of places set aside for **returning students** is 745. These places will be allocated in the first instance to students who were already allocated accommodation in the academic year 2025/2026. These students must meet all requirements specified in art. 1 above and:

- a. have renewed enrolment in the academic year 2026/2027 OR
- b. have been enrolled in the third year of a Bachelor's degree programme in a. y. 2025/2026, still not have earned their Bachelor's degree on the date of publication of the final ranking specified in art. 4.3

of this call, and intend to enrol in a Master's degree programme in a. y. 2026/2027.

These students must have submitted an application for admission into a Master's degree programme before the application deadline for this call. They must NOT renew enrolment into the Bachelor's degree programme.

If allocated accommodation, these students must accept their assigned place, but will be allowed to move into their accommodation only from the date of enrolment in the Master's degree. If they fail to enrol, they will forfeit the assigned accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee already paid.

The provisional number of places set aside for new admissions is 600. This number may be increased, should there still be places available once all eligible returning students have been accommodated. Places reserved for new admissions will be allocated as follows: 2/3 to first-year students, and 1/3 to subsequent-year students.

Moreover, in accordance with the provisions of Decree no. 21650 dated 13 November 2002 of the Director General for Education, Training and Employment of the Lombardy Region, these places will be divided as follows:

- 67% of places for EU students;
- 33% of places for non-EU students.

N.B.: Places available at Residenza Cascina Codazza in Lodi are reserved for students of the Lodi campus. These places will be allocated to students who appear as beneficiaries or eligible students in the ranking lists for the allocation of DSU accommodation (both returning students and new admissions).

Any remaining places may be assigned to non-eligible students of the Lodi campus at short-term housing rates, upon request. Interested students are invited to submit a request via InformaStudenti.

Should there still be places available after this round of allocation, the remaining places may be assigned to students enrolled in other programmes not based at the Lodi Campus.

Article 3 – HOW TO APPLY AND DEADLINE

3.1 – How to apply

Applications for accommodation must be submitted via the Online Helpdesk at <https://studente.unimi.it/dirittoallostudio/>. This applies to both new admissions and returning students. In order to log in, you have to:

- use your university username and password OR
- register to the University portal at https://registrazione.unimi.it/reg_utenti_esterni/registrazione/form.html and then enter your registration credentials (N.B.: if you already have a university account, or have already registered on the portal to apply for admission or for other services, you must use the credentials you already have).

After checking your personal data and completing any missing information about your enrolment, go to "Choice of Benefits" and proceed as follows:

- 1) select "University accommodations";
- 2) enter the requested data regarding income, merit and other statements;
- 3) indicate the halls of residence where you would like to be accommodated, in top-down order, starting from your preferred option (new admissions only); students of the Lodi campus can only select Residenza Cascina Codazza;
- 4) once the application is complete, **confirm it and submit it**.

You will then receive a confirmation of the application submission at the email address you used to log in, with a summary of all benefits requested for the a. y. 2026/2027.

N.B.: Each student can only submit ONE APPLICATION.

Students who submit multiple applications by registering more than once will be automatically excluded from the ranking. Applications cannot be modified or cancelled once submitted.

3.2 – Deadline for applying for accommodation and submitting income documents

Applications for accommodation must be submitted **between 10 July and 7 August 2026 (14.00 GMT+2)**, following the procedures described in art. 3.1.

N.B.: Applicants must sign the Single Substitute Statement for their ISEE University certificate or send their income documents (as indicated in the Call for applications for regional scholarships for the a. y. 2026/2027, which this call refers to) **by the closing date of this call**.

No extensions will be allowed.

Applications that are incomplete, have not been confirmed or do not contain all the required documents **will be disregarded**. The same will happen for duplicate applications. Applicants will also be excluded from the rankings if they upload invalid documents or submit the required documents **after 7 August 2026** (i.e. the closing date of this call). Applications from students who are in arrears on payments will also be discarded.

Article 4 – RANKING LISTS AND PUBLICATION

4.1 – Ranking procedures and criteria

Based on the income, merit and academic progression requirements indicated in the Call for applications for the awarding of regional scholarships under the education incentive programme for the a. y. 2026/2027, the University will draw up five different rankings:

- a) returning students who were already allocated accommodation in the academic year 2025/2026;
- b) new admissions of **EU students** enrolled in the **first year** of Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools;
- c) new admissions of **non-EU students** enrolled in the **first year** of Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools;
- d) new admissions of **EU students** enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools **in years subsequent to the first**;
- e) new admissions of **non-EU students** enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes and postgraduate schools **in years subsequent to the first**.

The ranking order will be determined by taking into account merit and income scores. If two or more applicants achieve the same total score, precedence will be given to the applicant who earned their previous qualification (high school diploma, Bachelor's degree, etc.) with the highest mark. If the high school diploma/degree mark is the same, precedence will be given to the younger applicant.

Eligible students with a disability at or above 66% or a recognised handicap pursuant to article 3, paragraphs 1 and 3 of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 take precedence over other applicants.

Students who have applied for accommodation despite having an ISEE University above the threshold will be ranked after all applicants who meet the income requirements specified in the Call for applications for regional scholarships for the a. y. 2026/2027, and will be considered eligible for accommodation at short-term housing rates, should any places still be available.

N.B.: students cannot choose the type of room they are assigned.

The University will take into account students' preferences regarding the hall of residence in which they would like to be accommodated, but **positioning in the ranking will be the only criterion used for allocating accommodation places**. Therefore, students may be accommodated in their first-choice hall of residence, second-choice hall of residence and so on, depending on their position in the relevant ranking.

4.2 – Provisional rankings: publication and appeals

Provisional rankings will be published on **19 August 2026 after 14.00** on the [Online Helpdesk](#).

Each ranking will show **eligible students** (i.e. those who meet the requirements for accommodation) and **non-eligible students** (i.e. those who do not meet the requirements for accommodation).

Non-eligible students may lodge an appeal **by 21 August 2026 (23.59 GMT+2)**.

The appeal must be lodged via the [Online Helpdesk](#) (under Rankings > Appeal the decision) and must include supporting documents that can serve as evidence of the applicant's claim of eligibility. **Students may not appeal if their ineligibility is due to failure to comply with any deadline or requirement specified in this call for applications.** Students will be notified of the outcome of their appeal when the final rankings are published.

4.3 – Final rankings

The final rankings, as described in art. 4.1., will be published in the [Online Helpdesk](#) according to the following schedule:

- **Returning students:** 24 August 2026 after 14.00;
- **New admissions:** 28 August 2026 after 14.00.

Each ranking will show the names of **beneficiaries** (students who HAVE BEEN allocated accommodation), **eligible students** (those who have NOT been allocated accommodation despite meeting the requirements specified in this call; they may become beneficiaries in the event of a ranking update, as per art. 6) and **non-eligible students** (students who do not meet the requirements).

BENEFICIARIES must accept or decline the accommodation offer by the deadline specified in art. 5 below, by following the procedures described in the same article.

Article 5 – ALLOCATION OF ACCOMMODATION TO BENEFICIARIES

To accept the accommodation offer, applicants who appear as **beneficiaries** in the rankings must log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and follow the ranking-specific instructions specified below.

5.1 – Returning students: deadlines and allocation of accommodation

Between 24 and 26 August 2026 (23.59 GMT +2), returning students who appear as beneficiaries in the final ranking are required to log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and either **accept** or **decline** the accommodation offer.

To ACCEPT the accommodation offer, you have to do the following (please note that you also need to be regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the a. y. 2026/2027):

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "accept";
- c) **confirm that you are enrolled** in the academic year 2026/2027 and specify your matriculation number;
- d) accept the accommodation offer and agree to the terms and conditions set out in the letter of commitment to pay the fees due (see article 9 of this call);
- e) **pay the €299 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance.**

This amount is a down payment on the total accommodation fees due for the academic year in question.

Returning students who have applied for accommodation while declaring their intention to enrol in a Master's degree programme, but have not finalised enrolment yet, must accept the allocated accommodation by the applicable deadline. However, they will be allowed to move into their accommodation only from the date they finalise enrolment in the Master's degree programme.

If they fail to enrol, they will forfeit the assigned accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee already paid.

At the end of the acceptance procedure, all students who are regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the academic year 2026/2027 will receive a letter of admission at their university email address. This letter must be presented to the director of the assigned hall of residence, together with an ID, in order to check in **by the applicable deadline indicated in the letter**.

Students who do not check in at the assigned hall of residence by the applicable deadline indicated in the admission letter will forfeit their accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee.

To DECLINE the accommodation offer, please follow the steps below:

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "decline".

N.B.: There will be NO EXTENSION of the deadline.

Students who fail to accept the accommodation offer by the deadline will be deemed to have declined the offer and will forfeit their accommodation. Returning students selected as beneficiaries who fail to accept the offer and to sign the letter of commitment by the deadline will lose their right to accommodation and will have to vacate their accommodation no later than 30 September 2026.

5.2 – New admissions: deadlines and allocation of accommodation

The number of new admissions will be determined based on the number of places available after returning students have accepted/declined their offers. These places will be divided between EU first-year students, non-EU first-year students and subsequent-year students, and allocated to applicants who have placed high enough in the relevant ranking.

It is the student's responsibility to view the rankings published in the [Online Helpdesk](#), as well as any related communications.

This online publication serves as official notice; students will not receive any personal email.

Between 28 and 31 August 2026 (23.59 GMT +2), students who appear as beneficiaries in the final ranking are required to log into the [Online Helpdesk](#) and either **accept** or **decline** the accommodation offer.

Places are allocated based on the ranking order and taking into account the preferences expressed by students in their application. Students cannot ask to change their allocated accommodation.

To ACCEPT the accommodation offer, you have to do the following (please note that you also need to be regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the a. y. 2026/2027):

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "accept";
- c) **confirm that you are enrolled** in the academic year 2026/2027 and specify your matriculation number;
- d) accept the accommodation offer and agree to the terms and conditions set out in the letter of commitment to pay the fees due (see article 9 of this call);
- e) **pay the €299 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance**.

This amount is a down payment on the total accommodation fees due for the academic year in question.

Students who have applied for accommodation while declaring their intention to enrol but have not finalised enrolment yet must accept the allocated accommodation by the applicable deadline and **must finalise enrolment by 30 September 2026 (or by the latest enrolment deadline contemplated by the call for applications for admissions to the relevant degree programme)**. If they fail to enrol, they will forfeit the assigned accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee already paid.

At the end of the acceptance procedure, all students who are regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the academic year 2026/2027 will receive a letter of admission at their university email address. This letter must be presented to the director of the assigned hall of residence, together with an ID, in order to check in **by the applicable deadline indicated in the letter**. Students who are not yet enrolled in the academic year 2026/2027 will receive their admission letter only after they finalise enrolment.

Please note that acceptance is FINAL. Students who have accepted the accommodation offer **may not, in any case, be allocated a new lodging** (neither in the same hall of residence, nor in another one).

Students who do not check in at the assigned hall of residence by the applicable deadline indicated in the admission letter will forfeit their accommodation and will not be refunded the reservation fee.

There will be NO EXTENSION of the deadline. Students who fail to accept the accommodation offer by the deadline will be deemed to have declined the offer and will forfeit their accommodation.

To DECLINE the accommodation offer, please follow the steps below:

- a) log into the [Online Helpdesk](#);
- b) select "decline".

N.B.: Students who neither accept nor decline the offer by the deadline will be deemed as having declined the offer. **In no case may students accept the offer after the deadline.**

Article 6 – RANKING UPDATES FOR NEW ADMISSIONS AND ALLOCATION OF ACCOMMODATION AT SHORT-TERM HOUSING RATES

If a beneficiary student declines or fails to accept the accommodation offer, **their place will be allocated to the next eligible student in the relevant ranking** (by following the procedure described in art. 5.2) and the ranking will be updated accordingly.

Ranking updates will be published in the [Online Helpdesk](#), until all the places have been allocated. New beneficiaries must accept or decline the accommodation offer during the time windows specified below:

- first ranking update: from 7 to 9 September 2026 (23.59 GMT +2);
- second ranking update: from 14 to 16 September 2026 (23.59 GMT +2);
- last ranking update: 15 October 2026 (14.00 GMT+2)

Article 7 – ACCOMMODATION PERIOD

The accommodation periods for the academic year 2026/2027 are:

- a) for returning students: from 1 October 2026 to 31 July 2027 and from 1 to 30 September 2027;
- b) for returning students who are enrolled in their first year off track (*primo anno fuori corso*): from 1 October 2026 to 31 March 2027;
- c) for new students: from 1 October 2026 (or later, if they are allocated accommodation as a result of a ranking update) to 31 July 2027 and from 1 to 30 September 2027;
- d) for new students who are enrolled in their first year off track (*primo anno fuori corso*): from 1 October 2026 (or later, if they are allocated accommodation as a result of a ranking update) to 31 March 2027.

In August, all the halls of residence will be closed. Students must move out of the assigned accommodation by the end of July, removing all personal belongings.

Article 8 – REQUEST TO CHANGE ACCOMMODATION (RETURNING STUDENTS ONLY)

Returning students who appear as beneficiaries are automatically allocated the same accommodation as the previous academic year.

After submitting their application, returning students may request a change of accommodation by sending a message via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Request to change accommodation. The request to change accommodation must be sent between 10 and 14 July 2026 (14.00 GMT +2).

Requests to change accommodation will be accepted **based on the applicant's position in the previous year's ranking, provided that there are still places available**. Students whose request to change accommodation is accepted will receive an email at their university email address **by the end of July**, and will have to move into the new accommodation starting from 1 September 2026.

Article 9 – ACCOMMODATION FEES AND PAYMENT METHODS

9.1 – Standard subsidised DSU fee for students enrolled on track

Students enrolled on track must pay the following standard subsidised fee, which covers the whole accommodation period (see art. 7):

- **Returning students:** €2,799.00

The fee is to be paid as follows:

- a) €299 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €750 (first instalment) by 15 January 2027;
- c) €750 (second instalment) by 15 April 2027;
- d) €1,000 (third instalment) by 15 June 2027;

- **New admissions:** €2,799.00

The fee is to be paid as follows:

- a) €299 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €750 (first instalment) by 15 January 2027;
- c) €750 (second instalment) by 15 April 2027;
- d) €1,000 (third instalment) by 15 June 2027, or by 15 September 2027 for first-year students.

All payments must be made via pagoPA at https://studente.unimi.it/fo_pagamenti/. **All instalments must be paid by the relevant deadline** specified above. For recipients of regional scholarships, this is also necessary to maintain non-resident status. There will be no deadline extensions.

Students who fail to pay any instalment by the relevant deadline will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it, but **they will still have to pay the standard subsidised fee for the whole accommodation period**. For scholarship recipients, any amount due will be withheld from the scholarship.

Students who are not scholarship recipients will be required to pay any outstanding amounts upon vacating their accommodation.

9.2 – Standard subsidised DSU fee for students enrolled in the first year off track

The standard subsidised fee for students enrolled in their first year off track is €1,549.00. This amount covers the accommodation period specified in art. 7 and must be paid in two instalments:

- a) €299 reservation fee within 24 hours of acceptance;
- b) €1,250 to be paid by 15 January 2027.

All payments must be made via pagoPA at https://studente.unimi.it/fo_pagamenti/.

All instalments must be paid by the relevant deadline specified above. For recipients of regional scholarships, this is also necessary to maintain non-resident status. There will be no deadline extensions.

Students who fail to pay any instalment by the relevant deadline will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it immediately, but **they will still have to pay the standard subsidised fee for the whole accommodation period**. For scholarship recipients, any amount due will be withheld from the scholarship. Students who are not scholarship recipients will be required to pay any outstanding amounts upon vacating their accommodation.

Students who are enrolled in their first year off track and **do not graduate by March 2027** may request to extend their stay from 1 April to 30 July 2027 (or May or June, if they expect to graduate earlier). If the request is accepted, they will be allocated accommodation at short-term housing rates (see art. 9.3). This request for extension must be submitted around November via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Extension of stay for off-track students.

Students will receive a reply by the Residence Hall Office at their university email address.

If the request is accepted, the student will be required to pay the whole amount due for the entire duration of the requested extension, even if they decide to move out of the accommodation earlier.

9.3 – Fee for short-term housing for students

The fee for short-term housing amounts to €400.00 for a double room and €450.00 for a single room per month. Payment is due by the 20th of the preceding month. Students who fail to pay any monthly fee by the relevant deadline will automatically forfeit their accommodation and will be required to vacate it immediately. However, they will still have to pay the fee for the whole accommodation period reserved to them, even if they decide to move out of the accommodation earlier.

9.4 – Reductions on the standard subsidised fee

In the letter of commitment signed upon acceptance, students undertake to pay the full amount due, regardless of the period of actual use of the accommodation.

Should they decide to move out before the end of the accommodation period, the Residence Hall Office will accept their request to move out earlier only once they have paid all outstanding amounts. This also applies to students who withdraw from studies. Students who graduate before the end of the accommodation period must also move out of the assigned accommodation, but will still be required to pay the amount due for the whole accommodation period.

The only exception to this rule is for students taking part in an international mobility programme, as provided for in art. 10, point a (Moving out to participate in an international mobility programme).

Article 10 – MOVING OUT OF ACCOMMODATION

Students who have accepted an accommodation offer are to live in the assigned hall of residence for the whole accommodation period. If they decide to move out of the accommodation earlier, they must notify the Residence Hall Office and wait for their authorisation before vacating the accommodation.

The request for authorisation to move out earlier must be submitted via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations / Authorisation to move out, in all the following cases:

a) The student is moving out to participate in an international mobility programme

Students who have been allocated accommodation and are to participate in an international mobility programme in the academic year 2026/2027 must notify the **Residence Hall Office**

at least 15 days before the start of their stay abroad.

Students will be exempted from paying accommodation fees (see art. 9) for the months they spend abroad only if their stay is documented by an official document stating the dates and destination of their mobility (e.g. Learning Agreement), and provided that they produce a copy of a paid lease agreement in their name in the destination country.

Before leaving, students must remove all personal belongings from the accommodation. At the end of their mobility programme, students must give **at least 15 days' notice** of their return by sending a message via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations. To this message, they must attach proof of the lease instalments paid abroad, plus the certificate of stay. The Residence Hall Office will then accommodate them in the same place as before.

b) The student is moving out temporarily for more than 10 days

Students who wish to move out of the assigned accommodation temporarily, but for more than 10 days, must notify the Residence Hall Office via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations **at least 7 days before leaving**. The Residence Hall Office will authorise the students to move out within 5 days of receipt of the request.

c) The student is moving out because of withdrawal from studies or transfer to another university

Students who decide to withdraw from studies or transfer to another university must give **at least 7 days' notice** by writing a message via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations. The Residence Hall Office will reply within 5 days, after checking if there are any outstanding payments.

d) The student is moving out earlier for personal reasons

Students who, for personal reasons, wish to move out before the end of the accommodation period must inform the Residence Hall Office via [InformaStudenti](#) / FEES AND BENEFITS / Accommodations **at least 7 days** before their intended check-out date. The Residence Hall Office will notify the student of any amounts due and authorise the student to move out within 7 days of the request, once all outstanding payments have been settled.

Students will automatically forfeit the assigned accommodation in all cases contemplated under art. 11 below. Upon moving out, these students will be required to settle any outstanding amounts. If a student who is a scholarship recipient forfeits accommodation and fails to pay the outstanding amounts, these will be withheld from the scholarship.

Article 11 – FORFEITING ACCOMMODATION

The following students will forfeit accommodation:

- 1) those who fail to accept the accommodation offer by the applicable deadline specified herein;
- 2) those who are not regularly enrolled in the academic year 2026/2027;
- 3) **those who have been ascertained to reside in a municipality from which they need less than 90 minutes to reach their campus with public transport, or have registered the assigned hall of residence as their permanent residence address;**
- 4) those who submitted false declarations to the University of Milan regarding their income, merit, regular academic progression and residence, in order to appear eligible for DSU accommodation: these students will be required to pay a whole year of accommodation at short-term housing rates. False statements are subject to the sanctions provided for in articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree no. 445/2000;
- 5) those who receive disciplinary sanctions for breaching university regulations: in this case, the student must nevertheless pay the full annual or six-month fee, regardless of the date of forfeiture;
- 6) those who fail to pay accommodation fees by the respective deadlines, or are otherwise in arrears with any payment due to the University.

- 7) those who withdraw from studies, transfer to another university or graduate before the end of the assigned accommodation period; these students have an obligation to move out earlier, but must pay the accommodation fees due for the whole accommodation period.

Article 12 – STUDENTS ATTENDING THE OPEN SEMESTER WHO ARE TO MATRICULATE INTO THE SECOND SEMESTER

Students who have registered for the so-called "open semester" at the University of Milan **must** follow the instructions specified herein to apply for accommodation. The application deadline is the same as for all other students. Should these students appear as beneficiaries in the ranking list, they will be assigned accommodation at short-term housing rates (see art. 9.3) for the first semester.

If, following publication of the national rankings for admission into the degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine or Veterinary Medicine, they matriculate into the University of Milan, they will be assigned that same accommodation for the whole year at DSU rates. The accommodation fees due will be recalculated, taking into account any amounts already paid.

Subsequently, the Residence Hall Office will draw up a separate ranking for students who have applied for accommodation with another university but decide to matriculate into the University of Milan following publication of the national rankings for admission into the degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery, Dental Medicine or Veterinary Medicine.

This article may be amended in the future, should new criteria be established after the call for applications to the open semester is published.

Article 13 – DATA PROCESSING

Personal data collected for the purposes of this call for applications will be processed in accordance with Legislative Decree no. 196 of 30 June 2003 (Italian Personal Data Protection Act), as subsequently amended and supplemented, and with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (European General Data Protection Regulation, or GDPR).
